Member Spotlight -- Jill Gant

"All things are our relatives; what we do to everybody, we do to ourselves. All is really One." This Native American quote shared by Jill Gant illustrates her gentle spirit that finds the treasures of energy, hope and strength in animals, in nature, and in *all* of us.

Jill's passion for education, life-long learning, and diversity fell into place after watching her parents' tireless advocacy for social justice and civil rights. Jill witnessed injustices and prejudices at an early age while her parents worked as educators for the Wisconsin School for the Deaf. Jill said, "Often, people misunderstood deafness and sign language referring to the deaf as 'those people' and calling the deaf weird or drunk if they attempted speech." Her parents' work



and advocacy in the community left a lasting impact. She watched her parents march through Delavan in support of the protest marches led by John Lewis in Selma, Alabama. The stereotyping, prejudice, and mean jokes challenged Jill's spirit and influenced her greatly to become actively involved with racial justice.

Jill Gant became a teacher, then a school counselor. What distinguishes Jill is her kindness, openness, desire to learn, and her love for *all things*. Jill believes that diversity and multicultural education strengthens people. She finds listening more important than talking or speech making. Jill became an active member of the Diversity Action Team in the very early stages of the organization. She is currently the DAT secretary and has served in numerous rolls over the years. If you want to know what motivates her, it's chocolate! In times of despair, as we all have experienced this past year, Jill finds comfort in her care for a beloved horse or family dog to keep her energy and joy for life alive. Beauty is all around us when our eyes are open. Jill suggests, "using your energy to seek out truth and beauty in the new year."
