This particular series follows Omakayas (o-MA-kay-as) and her Anishinabe family through challenges, tragedy and triumph as they work together to survive on their island home in La Pointe, WI on Lake Superior during a time of encroaching white settlement, missionaries and the fur trade, and then their forced movement.
